Shadow, light and sand shows are expected.






Mashup queens

In 2023, mashups made their mark on the music scene. These hybrid compositions, resulting from the fusion of distinct songs, have contributed to increase the influence of Arab music.

Some of the most popular 2023 mash-ups include Egyptian singer Sherine Abdel Wahab, with her successful collaboration with rapper Nelly for "Just a Dream", and the one of Palestinian singer Elyanna. Her cover of "Calling U" by Danish band Outlandish combined with Amr Diab's "Tamally Maak" was a hit.

Mohammed Zaanoun is a Palestinian photographer who documents the violence and destruction he witnesses in Gaza. He has been working as a photojournalist for over fifteen years. He has taken portraits of residents who, like him, have had to abandon their homes following Israeli strikes. Today, he is covering the horrors of the conflict in Gaza; the constant bombardment; the despair of the inhabitants; the lack of water, bread, medicine, support... The lack of everything.

Owner Fawaz Alsoulaim actively encourages local talent. Artists such as Nader al-Fassam regularly perform there.



Restoration of iconic Arab films

This project involves the restoration of 50 films. The process will update them to 4K format to ensure image clarity and protection against the eleme film.


The 1st film restored is "Les Misérables" by Atef Salem, 1978, and based on the novel by Victor Hugo. It features famous actors such as Farid Shawqi, Mohsena Tawfik, Adel Adham, Laila Eloui, Ferdos Abdel Hamid, ...

A look back at "Fault Lines"

The exhibition by Lebanese artist Ramzi Mallat was recently held at the P21 gallery in London. It pays tribute to the victims of the explosion in the port of Beirut on 4 August 2020.

Mallat, a graduate of the Royal College of Art, presented sculptures of coloured maamouls in glass and resin. His work explores themes of individual vulnerability and hope, while questioning social and political fractures. The exhibition also included other three-dimensional works and a film, 'Sobhiyé', which weaves a political and socio-economic narrative of Lebanon.

A notable piece was a grid decorated with small cups, representing the interdependence of the world's economies.





"Partisans of the Nude"

The exhibition explores
the nude in Arab art,
and runs until 14
January at the Wallach
Art Gallery, part of
Columbia University in
the US.

Curated by Kirsten Scheid, it features over 50 paintings and 20 drawings. It highlights the importance of the nude in defining the identity and modern Islamic practice of future Arab citizens. A series of short videos of contemporary testimonies explore the implication of the nude in aesthetic developments, political debates and literary and musical movements.


Mariam, the first

Majorelle garden turns 100!

Originally established in 1924
by French painter Jacques
Majorelle, it is known for its
blue colours, and its botanical
wonderland inspired by
Islamic and tropical gardens.

It houses two museums: the Musée Pierre Bergé des Arts Berbères and the Musée Yves Saint Laurent Marrakech.

It welcomes 900,000 visitors each year, and will clebrate its anniversary with many cultural events this year.
